

## GLOBE TRAIN THE TRAINERS WORKSHOP AT DELHI

---

The **GLOBE (Global Learning and Observations to Benefit the Environment) Train-The-Trainers Workshop** organized by Regional GOLBE Office for Asia-Pacific during June 2–5, 2010 at Bhabha Chamber, Scope Convention Centre, Lodi Road and American Centre, New Delhi. The workshop was supported by Public Affairs Section American Embassy, New Delhi and Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India.

The presence of Ms. Elizabeth Thornhill, Deputy Public Affair Officer, US Embassy, Ms. Diane Brandt, Public Affair Section, American Embassy and Mr. R. Mehta – Advisor, MOEF, Govt. of India has added more values to the workshop.



The Workshop was attended by 30 participants from both India and Abroad. A group of 4 Master Trainers provided hands-on experience to the participants during the training workshop [*Kindly refer Annexure 1 for List of Participants and Master Trainers*].

The Workshop started on June 2, 2010 with the Welcome Speech of Dr. Desh Bandhu, Director, GLOBE Regional Office and President, IES. He welcomed the GLOBE training team as well as the participants from all over the country and neighbouring countries (Bhutan & Nepal). He gave a brief introduction about the GLOBE Programme. Global Learning and Observations to Benefit the Environment (GLOBE) is a hands - on international environmental science and educational programme. The GLOBE Programme was introduced in April 1994 by U. S. Vice President Al Gore. It involves active participation of teachers, students and scientific research community in an effort to learn more about the environment and in performing experiments and analyzing data. It would strengthen the interaction or partnership between students and researchers etc. and will also help in establishing strong network and linkage with peer groups all across the world. It covers all the major components of environment like Atmosphere, Hydrology, Land Cover and soils. He also assured that the stay of both participants and the trainers would be made comfortable in every possible manner.

Followed by the welcome address, Mr. R. Mehta, Advisor – Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India and the Country Coordinator, GLOBE-India briefed the participants and the guests about the Objectives of the Workshop. Revealing that 4 trainers and around 30 participants from all over the world were participating in the workshop, he said the workshop serves the twin purpose of 'teaching the trainees' and 'helping the society' as a whole in the sphere of environment. He stressed on the need for spreading awareness among the masses and said understanding the globe through practical training and scientific learning would help overcome many environmental problems.



Being the country coordinator, he informed about the status of the GLOBE Programme in

India which started in 2000. He told that the GLOBE Programme is being implemented in 16 states of the Country namely Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Assam, Orissa, Goa, Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir, Uttaranchal, Sikkim, West Bengal, Tripura, Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Himachal Pradesh. 100 Schools from each state are involved in the GLOBE Programme.

After the brief introduction about the GLOBE Program by Mr. R. Mehta, Ms. Elizabeth Thornhill, Deputy Public Affair Officer, US Embassy appreciated the efforts made by Indian Environmental Society for organizing the International GLOBE Training Workshop. She mentioned that GLOBE links students, teachers, and the scientific research community in an effort to learn more about the environment through student data collection and observation. She also extended her help, on behalf of American Embassy, needed for implementing the GLOBE Programme in India and has promised to provide necessary guidance at the time of need.

In the end, Ms. Diane Brandt, Public Affair Section, American Embassy gave the Vote of Thanks. She accentuated the significance of the workshop to all the participants. She extended her gratitude to Dr. Desh Bandhu and Mr. R. Mehta and also thanked all the participants and others who were directly or indirectly associated with the workshop.

After the inaugural session, the participants introduced themselves. There were two participants from Bhutan (Mr. Binod Rai & Ms. Namkha Lhamo), one from Nepal (Mrs Leela Pradhan) and rest were from different parts of India. Most of the participants were teachers and few of them were associated with NGOs. They were all looking forward to this session and excited about the practical training that would be imparted to them during the workshop.

Dr. Desh Bandhu gave a brief presentation on the GLOBE programme, its objectives and the various events and activities conducted under the programme. He then went on to explain the details of the four day schedule of the workshop to the participants.

### **GLOBE sessions**

The workshop focused on GLOBE's 'Basic' Protocols:

1. Atmospheric Protocol
2. Hydrology Protocol
3. Soil Protocol
4. Land Cover Protocol

The workshop comprised of variety of interesting activities including GLOBE theoretical sessions, computer tutorial sessions, hands-on measurements i.e. field work. June 2 focused on the theory of Atmosphere, Soil and Hydrology Protocol. The participants even learned how to use GPS. 3<sup>rd</sup> June morning session started with theory on Landcover Protocol and field survey of Soil and Hydrology protocol.

On June 4th participants were taken to the residence of Chief Minister of Delhi, Mrs Sheela Dixit. There they were taken to the herbal garden in her residence and later on she addressed the participants. Michael Pelletier, Minister Counselor for Public Affairs, American Embassy was also present during this session. After a tea break in her residence participants were taken for a field visit for Landcover Protocol. After lunch they went to American Centre where they learnt the procedure of data feeding on computers. Ms. Elizabeth Thornhill invited everyone present to attend the Eco-festival held in the American Centre on the eve of World Environment Day. *[Kindly refer the programme schedule attached as annexure 2]*



The participants were divided in two groups (GROUP A and GROUP B) during the field training of Soil and Hydrology protocol while four groups were made during Landcover protocol.
